Step 2: What is your paper topic? This can be just a few words that describe your main idea (it might help to think of this as your title).

Smoking is bad for everyone: Make it illegal

Step 3: What is your position? That is, what do you believe to be *true* about your topic?

I believe that smoking is unhealthy, not just for the people who smoke, but for the people around them. They also create a lot of litter by throwing cigarettes on the ground.

Step 4: What exceptions or counter-arguments are there to your ideas? That is, what disagreements might others have? List them here. You might start your explanation with: *In spite of* or *Despite*.

In spite of the fact that smoking is unhealthy, many people believe that it is their right to do what they want with their own health, and they believe smoking is enjoyable.

Step 5: Why do you think you are right, even though some people might disagree?
